

LITTLE DREAMERS HAVE BIG DREAMS



Let's make them come true.

The DREAM Act in the Senate immigration reform bill (S. 744) provides immigrants who entered the United States as children with a chance to make their dreams come true. However, DREAMers who are too young to have completed high school don't qualify for the DREAM Act's five-year path to citizenship. These children must wait up to 13 years – for some, their entire childhoods – to become citizens of the only country they've ever known.

The Little DREAMers Amendment would give the youngest children access to the same five-year path to citizenship as older DREAMers. More than 185 child advocacy, faith-based, education, labor, and immigrant rights organizations agree, it's the right thing to do for children.
