Unfortunately, we are currently failing kids. Recent years have shown declining outcomes in terms of mental health, infant mortality, food security, child poverty and more. Our children deserve better. We ask that you join in rededicating your attention and efforts to children through *Children's Week*.

*Children's Week* is an annual effort by the children's community to focus attention on children in national and political discourse. While children should be a unifying issue, they are often a political afterthought. Children's Week strives to rectify this and bring children to the front of the conversation.

Every year during the second full week of June, organizations highlight recent achievements for children and bring attention to areas where further progress is needed. We host events and briefings, work with members on progressing legislation, mobilize grassroots actions, and more.
